On Tuesday Hazel Williams and Zach Henderson represented our school at the South Wairarapa Interschool Speech Competition. Zach and Hazel approached their speech from two different angles. One was structured to entertain the audience while the other was to shock and challenge the audience's thinking. Both speeches were incredibly well researched, thought out and articulately presented. Zach's speech was called "The Bachelor TV series of the Animal Kingdom". In his speech he talked about four contestants (The Pink Fairy Armadillo, The Red Hand Fish, The Aye Aye and The Turtle Fish) and how they competed against each other to win your heart and a date. Sounds strange but it was entertaining, interesting and won over the audience!

Hazel took a more formal approach and spoke about "Why you should not smoke.". She talked about four main points; Why it is bad for your health, a waste of money, a waste of time and the negative impact it has on the environment. One of her key challenges to get you thinking was..."Did you know that if you smoked 3 cigarettes per day for a year it is the same as smoking continually for 8 days (192 hours straight)?" SMART WATCHES

We are noticing that more and more children are coming to school with Smart Watches that have phone and texting features. We acknowledge that these help parents and children keep in touch and they are part of everyday life. However they also come with their own issues for us (eg: children texting parents to say they are unwell before a teacher or the office is informed and can make a decision, interrupting learning times, communication during an emergency that the staff are dealing with which can result in unsettling others or contacting parents before we can etc).

As a result the Board of Trustees have now added these devices to the Cellphone Procedures. This means that children will leave them at home or if needed hand them in to the teacher or office during school time. They can then pick them up at the end of the day which children do frequently with cell phones.

The only exception to this rule is parents who have filled out the permission slip and been given permission from the school for their child to wear it for medical reasons only. Notices of this policy and permission slips will be given out next week to children who wear them and will be available at the office if you need a copy at any stage.

Please be confident that if your child is unwell or there is an emergency during school hours we will look after your child and communicate this with you. If they need to get in contact with you during school time, they can come to the office to ring or you can ring the office so we can deliver a message to them.




